IMPORTANT NOTE

These Supplementary Regulations can only be used for Club Karting Competition at an Affiliated Karting Club in strict accordance with the requirements of all Federal and State Government COVID-19 Orders, Directions and Restrictions.

COVID-19 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND VOLUNTARY ACCEPTANCE OF RISK

By entering or participating in this Karting activity/event, all Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons acknowledge that, even with rigorous capacity and control measures that Karting Australia requires the Organising Club to put in place at all Karting Australia sanctioned Karting activities/events, there remains an unquantifiable risk of transmission of viral illness including COVID-19 at a Karting activity/event at this time and you have considered that risk and your own personal circumstances, including any health condition or vulnerability that you may have or that of persons whom you will be in close contact with following your attendance at a Karting activity/event. 8. MINIMUM ENTRIES				
5.1 8 is the minimum number of pre-entries which must be received for each Competition Group.				
5.2 If insufficient entries are received for a Competition Group to form in its own right, the Competition Group <u>must be</u> consolidated in accordance with the Competition Rules Chapter 1 – Rule 9.				

3. SPECIFIC COVID-19 RESTRICTION AND MITIGATION REQUIREMENTS



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COVIDSafe ACTION PLAN (When required at law)	
The Club has completed a COVIDSafe Action Plan and submitted it to the relevant State Government Department. All actions identified as being required to be done to create a COVIDSafe Event and Club facility must be carried out prior to and during the Event.	
1.	PERMITTED AND NON-PERMITTED PERSONS
1.1.	No person who has symptoms consistent with COVID-19 (this includes any fever, respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, sore throat, cough, lack of smell or fatigue) is permitted to attend the Circuit or participate in the Event.
1.2.	Any person who starts to feel unwell or to exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 during the Event must immediately avoid contact with all persons at the Circuit and MUST IMMEDIATELY LEAVE the Circuit.
2.	<u>Note – The number chosen in 2.1 must not exceed the maximum number of people permitted to gather under State Public Health Authority Orders/Directions/Regulations.</u> SOCIAL DISTANCING AND DENSITY REQUIREMENTS
2.1.	Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons are not permitted to gather in groups greater than Choose a number while in attendance at the Event. <i>(Delete if no limit on Group size by the State Government required)</i>
2.2.	Government prescribed Social Distancing measures must always be observed.
2.3.	The use by Permitted Persons of any indoor facilities is strictly limited by the Density Quotient of the room as included in the Club's COVIDSafe Action Plan.
2.4.	Food service provided at the Event must fully comply with all State Public Health Authority Orders/Directions/Regulations. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hand Hygiene must be available at all food service outlets. Regular cleaning in accordance with the Club's COVIDSafe Action Plan MUST be carried out throughout the Event.
3.	Check In Requirements
3.1	All Attendees MUST complete and submit the Karting Australia COVID-19 Declaration, or the compulsory State Government issued QR Code Check-In (delete which is not relevant) upon arrival at the venue if required by the State or Federal Government.
4.	HYGIENE FACILITIES - TOILET/WASHROOM FACILITIES and HAND SANITISER
4.1	The Club is required to provide facilities to ensure general and sensible hygiene practices are maintained.
4.2	Toilet and washroom facilities at the Circuit must be open and available for use.
4.3	Washroom facilities must be properly equipped with liquid soap, running water and either air hand driers or paper towels. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The toilets and washroom facilities must be cleaned at least once during the day or as otherwise required in accordance with the Club's COVIDSafe Action Plan
4.4	It is strongly recommended that Essential Karting Personnel and Permitted Persons bring their own supply of hand sanitiser for use in accordance with government recommendations in addition to hand sanitiser that is supplied by the Club.

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1.1	Qualifying	One 4 minute session – Qualifying will determine grid positions for Heat 1 & 2 – with fastest time on Grid 1, and so on
1.2	Heats 1 & 2	8 Laps each – Results from Qualifying – Fastest to the front for Heats 1 & 2
1.3	Heat 3	8 Laps – Points from Finishing Positions from Heats 1 & 2 – lowest points to pole and so on
1.4	Final	13 Laps – Final Only Counts – Finishing Positions from Heat 3 to Pole and so on

3.	KART RETRIEVAL
3.1.	Pit Crew with trolleys Will Not be given access to the Circuit during Qualifying and Racing.
3.2.	Retrieval of Karts is at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course
3.3.	Pit Crew must only enter the Circuit when permitted by the Grid Marshal or the Clerk of the Course and then only if wearing a HIGH VISIBILITY SAFETY VEST on the upper torso.
3.4.	Karts can be retrieved ONLY via discretion of Clerk of Course
4.	ADDITIONAL VENUE REQUIREMENTS
4.1.	<u>Subject to any applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, including but not limited to guide dogs, no animals are allowed anywhere within the facility.</u>
4.2.	No dumping of Fuel or Tyres, please make your own arrangements.
4.3.	No unlicensed driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Circuit.
4.4.	No motorised scooters, mini bikes, roller blading, skateboards, bicycles and tricycles allowed at the complex during the entire Meeting. Officials may confiscate any such items for the duration of the Meeting.
4.5.	Marquees are not to be erected without consent of the Club.
4.6.	<u>NO CAMPING ALLOWED IN THE VENUE</u>
